The <u>QGIS Grant Programme in 2022</u> resulted in <u>funding for 4 proposals</u>. Like in the previous year, we did not accept proposals for the development of new features. Proposals had to focus on improving the QGIS project infrastructure and polishing existing features. The target version for all project work was QGIS 3.28.
